Notes:

Parks, Recreation, and Open Space

- Need an inventory of facilities (restrooms, lighting, etc.) and their conditions
- The recreation center is small, needs to be tied into the sidewalks, the National Guard cut down its trees
- Seniors need small areas with shade, benches, walking paths; enjoy sitting to socialize, safety, water features
- River Forest's sewerage treatment area is maintained by the City
- Issues:
 - Accessibility is needed in the parks
 - Need pocket parks located close to residences instead of large parks far away
 - o A 10-min walk buffer may still require crossing a highway
 - Bike paths need colorization and sharrows
 - Need to make the fairgrounds multi-use; currently only single event purpose used once annually
 - There is a sewerage plant near ballfields
 - West 30s has no direct path from HA park to Tammany Trace
- Ideas:
 - o River Forest has a powerline easement with the potential for a greenway
 - Convert 1st Avenue Park into a passive park
 - o The Mayors Council proposed a physical activity station for Nose Park
 - Drainage in fields
 - o Need an all-inclusive playground with universal design
 - The space around Depores Street playground could be used

Healthy Communities

- Social determents of health can be analyzed by zip code
- Need for bike/ped connectivity and alternative transportation
- A Complete Streets policy is awaiting adoption by City Council
- HMGP grant to retrofit with permeable paving and green infrastructure
 - Are there local grants for businesses to switch from concrete to permeable surfaces?





- STP has the highest parish suicide rate; has a higher life expectancy and quality of healthcare
- Need a tobacco ordinance in the city and parish
- $_{\odot}$ 23% to bacco use in parish relates to nearly 80% of people avoiding that business Desired Changes
 - Improve mental health and substance abuse programs; domestic abuse
 Debate: publicize vs. privatize
 - Angel Program: converted an old bar into a regular AAA meeting location
 - Diversion programs exist but do not match the needs
 - Seeking increased awareness and justice reform
 - 6-10 community members from each district are to join the Mayor's Council
 - Helping Hands in the Savannahs: community-based senior assistance

Additional Information

- Katrina caused tree loss and brought in "outsiders"
- West 30s has a lot of "negative" buildings and uses
 - There is an undesired maintenance building across from the park
- Applied to the LA Healthy Communities Coalition for Bogue Chitto Park
- City Map: Eat Shop Dine includes an inventory of bike racks, trails, etc.
- NAMI app provides information on housing, mental health, etc. by zip code
